



To investigate still life paintings.






Do you know what still life means? What kind of painting technique does it use?

Still life means a painting or drawing of an arrangement of objects, typically including fruit, flowers, bowls and vases.





The same style of paintings were also found in some of the Roman wall paintings and floor mosaics.

Have a look at the paintings by different artists on the next slides. Can you think about these questions?:




Why do you think the artist used these objects?


How have the objects been arranged and what impact does this have?

What colour combinations have been used?






This is a seventeenth century still life painting by Jan Brueghel. It's called *Stillleben mit Blumengirlande*.










This is a still life painting by Willem Claeszoon Heda. It's called *Still Life with Gilt Goblet* (1635).








This is a seventeenth century still life painting by Panfilo Nuvolone. It's called *Still Life with Peaches*.






This is a still life painting by Maurice Prendergast. It's called *Still Life with Apples* (1910).







This is a still life painting by Evert Collier. It's called *Vanatis Still-life* (1705).








This is a bright still life painting by Petre Iorgulescu-Yor.
