With dashes this is a type of **parenthesis**, which means extra information which is not vital to the meaning of the sentence.

We went into the kitchen to find that the cakes – all ten of them – had vanished!

In this sentence, the dashes used for parenthesis helps us to draw our attention to the extra bit of information.

The dashes are short and don't touch eany letters on either side of them.
