

This what I already know about nocturnal creatures:

They stay awake at night, they hibernate. Owls are nocturnal they stay awake all night and sleep in the day. They can smell really well. These are nocturnal creatures - hedgehogs, cats, fox, owl, wolf. They live in a forest. Owls, foxes, hedgehogs, badgers, bats. Badgers, fox. They sleep in the day and come out at night when it is dark. Bats live in caves. They often live in the woods, they come out at night. Owl's hoot and say Twit, twoo. Bats can fly like owls. Bats and foxes are awake at night. Moles are nocturnal. Bats and fruit bats live in caves. Foxes eat bones. A firefly is nocturnal.

The questions I would like to ask and explore about nocturnal animals are:

Why do bats hang upside down? What do they do When do they sleep? I would like to know more about hedgehogs, foxes, and bats. Why do they come out at night? Where do they go in the day? What do they do at night? Can we help them in any way? What do bats eat and where do they sleep. Do bats really sleep upside down? Do bats have feet? What colour eyes do owls have? What do nocturnal animals eat? Do all nocturnal animals hibernate? Why are these animals nocturnal? To find out more about foxes. Are animals becoming less nocturnal? How do bats communicate? Is a slug a nocturnal animal - because they come out at night?

I would like to role play:

Pretend to be in a fox family. Dress up as bats and hang upside-down. Owls. Being a hedgehog out at night. To role play a wolf - maybe in a story - 3 little pigs or Red riding hood. Make a puppet and do a role play. Being a hedgehog. To make a cave or a fox house. To be a badger. How foxes communicate. Pretend to be fireflies with torches. Dress up as a nocturnal animal.

I would like to investigate and explore about nocturnal animals:

How do they see in the dark? To investigate caterpillars. A moth, wolf, spiders and owls. Investigate animal homes. Where do they live? What do they do at night and what do they eat? Find out more about foxes. Explore a deep dark wood. Why do their eyes glow?

I would like to make related to nocturnal animals:

Create a puppet show about nocturnal animals. Owl pictures. Make nocturnal animals out of playdough. A foxes den. A hedgehog or fox. To make a bat. A big tree with a tiny owl house, with a baby owl inside. A food tray for hedgehogs or a box with a blanket. Woodland creature masks. Hedgehog house. Make an owl from feathers. Fox mask. Make a burrow for the animals to sleep in. make a fox or a badger and do paintings. To colour in a badger. A nocturnal den.

I would like to visit or meet in relation to nocturnal animals:

To meet a Hedgehog. To meet a real owl. To meet a fox or a wolf. A forest or a park. To explore Binturong (Bearcat). The zoo. To hold a hedgehog whilst wearing gloves. Local habitats like Woods Mill. A hedgehog sanctuary. Knockhatch to see the owls. To meet a fox. To meet a vet. Go to the countryside. Go to a rescue centre. To visit a cave.

I would like to share or bring in related to our topic:

My nocturnal toys - fox and hedgehog. To bring in my book Wow said the Owl. My dinosaur. Toy owl. Mini torches, garden footage. A bat and a fox. Dressing up clothes. Bring in Woodland happy family cards. A book and a fox. An animal book- Animalium. Bring in a nature book. Some books - Super bat / night monkey Day monkey.

My other BIG ideas are:

To go to a hedgehog sanctuary to hold a real hedgehog. To go to the woods at night and spot some nocturnal creatures. Other nocturnal animal superheroes - like Batman. Find out what is the most dangerous nocturnal animal. To make hot chocolate. Dress up as animals, draw nocturnal animals, learn songs about nocturnal animals. Watch wildlife shows. Where does the sun go at night? To stay up all night like a night creature. Make the voices of the animals in a play.
