Understand how tourism can contribute and help a county's economy. Investigating the human and geographical features of the United States of America including states such as Florida, California, Hawaii, Texas and New York.

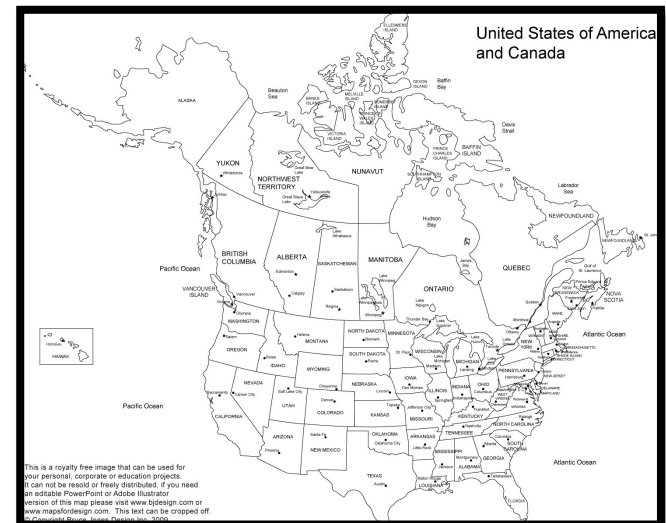
