Vocabulary:

**Good:** Use 3 Y3/4 spelling words

**Amazing:** Use 3 Y5/6 spelling words

**Awesome:** Up-level words in your writing with a synonym

**Good:** Use fronted adverbials

**Amazing:** Use subordinate clauses in different places
