Thank you to everyone for attending parents evenings earlier this week. The teachers were very pleased to see such a good response and enjoyed meeting you and we hope you found the meetings to be beneficial.

We have had a busy week in school. Reception children have been reading the story of Baby Owls and have made owls by stamping paint with pompoms. Year 1 have been learning about Neil Armstrong after their astronaut visit at the beginning of the week. Year 2 designed a coat for Miss Brett – much needed now the colder weather is approaching! Year 3 have been using their writing skills to write instructions on how to wash a woolly mammoth. Year 4's history topic is 'Music to Our Ears' and they have been learning how people used to visit music halls to listen to music. Year 5 have been writing biographies about their future self and Year 6 have also been busy writing their guide book about Brighton, after their recent visit to the town.

The disco raised £700 and this money will be going towards Read Write Inc phonics resources for parents to use at home to support their children's learning. We will be compiling a list of items the school would like to purchase from future Friends Association fundraising and this will be shared with parents in due course.

#### **Odd Socks Day**

Children are invited to wear "odd socks" to school on Friday 17<sup>th</sup> November as part of anti-bullying week. Throughout the week the children will be looking at work to do with anti-bullying and will mark the end of the week wearing odd socks to show how we celebrate the fact that everyone is different.

#### **Year 1 Space Experience**

On Monday this week Year 1 children received a visit from an Astronaut and Planetarium. When the children were in the planetarium they were able to see the sun, moon and other stars and planets up close. The Astronaut took the children on a journey simulating a rocket launch where they were able to see the earth getting smaller and how the environment changes as we land on the moon. The children even had the opportunity to make a Space Ted rocket!







## Free School Meals (FSM) Eligibility Criteria \*\*\*IMPORTANT - PLEASE READ\*\*\*\*

Free school meals in all West Sussex maintained and free schools and academies are available to pupils in receipt of, or whose parents are in receipt of, one or more of the following benefits –

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for the four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)

If you <u>are not</u> eligible for benefits-related, free school meals, but your child is currently in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2, they will automatically be entitled to Universal Infant Free school Meals and you need not apply.

If you <u>are</u> eligible for benefits-related free school meals in accordance with the above criteria, and your child is also receiving Universal Infant Free School Meals, it is important that you continue to register. This will enable us to claim valuable 'pupil premium' funding (currently £1,385 per child per annum). This additional funding can enable us to provide extra support for your child in school.

Once an eligible child is signed up for benefits related free school meals, they will also receive other support such as Holiday Activity and Food (HAF) sessions. HAF sessions provide children with access to fun and engaging activities during the holidays and offer a free meal as part of the sessions.

If you think your child(ren) may be eligible for benefits-related free school meals, please contact Mrs Matthews in the school office.




