#### **This Week**

Thank you for your continued support across the half term. I would like to share that recently we have welcomed quite a few visitors to St Peter's and all have commented on the excellent standards of behaviour and care demonstrated by your lovely children. The behaviour has been described as outstanding, which is great to hear. We are not surprised, as the children really do live by the school mission statement. We thought that you would like to know.

This week, we participated in Safer Internet Day. At St Peter's, we learn about online safety throughout each term, but the children enjoyed this week. Mr Healy and Mr English lead computing and would like to share some useful links with you this week. We are fully aware that technology is ever present and fast to develop. We are constantly thinking of ways in which to support the children in maintaining their own personal safety online and regularly talk to the children about the four 'C's: Contact, Content, Commerce and Conduct . This week we have been made even more aware that creating YouTube channels and content is a popular and regular hobby for some of our pupils. We are a little concerned about the growing number of pupils who seem to do this unsupervised. We will be reminding pupils that at their age, this should only be done under the close supervision of a parent or adult. Whilst this might not please them, it is important.

We have had a busy week in school. Reception and Year 2 took part in a Chinese dance workshop where they learned the peacock fan dance and a dragon parade. Reception children have also loved learning the story The Great Race, all about the animals for the Chinese New Year traditions. Year 1 made a toy museum. The children organised this themselves by putting the toys into groups, i.e. old games consoles, old wooden toys and new toys with batteries or wheels. They learned how to identify old toys and made a timeline of old toys all the way to new toys. Year 3 did drama based on the Romans. Year 4 have written exciting narrative about escaping from a Mayan temple, like Indiana Jones, and wrote letters of advice in the style of St Paul. Year 5 have been learning facts about the moon and the earth and also finished their art of Shoreham buildings. Year 6 have been very busy doing some mock SATs papers. We hope that you all enjoy your half term break and that we get some sunshine soon.

#### Measles

Cases of measles are rising across England, including among children and young people. The Department for Education has published new advice for managing measles outbreaks, including advice for parents on what to do when they suspect their child may have measles. Parents are advised that children with diagnosed measles should stay off nursery or school for at least 4 days from when the rash appears.

The symptoms of measles include -

- A high temperature
- A runny or blocked nose
- Sneezing
- A cough
- Red, sore, watery eyes
- Small white spots may appear inside the cheeks and on the back of the lips a few days later. These spots usually last a few days.
- A rash usually appears a few days after the cold-like symptoms. The rash starts on the face and behind the ears before spreading to the rest of the body.

The spots of the measles rash are sometimes raised and join together to form blotchy patches. They're not usually itchy.

It's very unlikely to be measles if a child has had both doses of the MMR vaccine or had measles previously. For further information please visit <a href="https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/measles">https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/measles</a>

#### Free School Meals (FSM) Eligibility Criteria \*\*\*IMPORTANT – PLEASE READ\*\*\*\*

Free school meals in all West Sussex maintained and free schools and academies are available to pupils in receipt of, or whose parents are in receipt of, one or more of the following benefits –

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for the four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)

If you <u>are not</u> eligible for benefits-related, free school meals, but your child is currently in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2, they will automatically be entitled to Universal Infant Free school Meals and you need not apply.

If you <u>are</u> eligible for benefits-related free school meals in accordance with the above criteria, and your child is also receiving Universal Infant Free School Meals, it is important that you continue to register. This will enable us to claim valuable 'pupil premium' funding (currently £1,385 per child per annum). This additional funding can enable us to provide extra support for your child in school.

Once an eligible child is signed up for benefits related free school meals, they will also receive other support such as Holiday Activity and Food (HAF) sessions. HAF sessions provide children with access to fun and engaging activities during the holidays and offer a free meal as part of the sessions.

If you think your child(ren) may be eligible for benefits-related free school meals, please contact Mrs Matthews in the school office.
